I write to inform you that Norm Riley, former DTSC Project Manager for SSFL and formerly in charge of DTSC's review of contamination issues at the neighboring proposed Runkle Ranch housing development, appears to now be working for KB Homes, the developer, in support of its efforts to develop Runkle. I also want to inform you that at a hearing on the project before the Simi Valley Planning Commission on June 20, Mr. Riley repeatedly spoke as though he were still with DTSC (speaking in the present tense about "we at DTSC," etc.), creating the impression, at least among some, that he was representing DTSC and its views.
