Santa Susana Field Laboratory (SSFL) Work Group Charter

A. SSFL Work Group - Definition

The SSFL Work Group is an ad hoc affiliation of federal, state and local regulatory agencies with regulatory jurisdiction or oversight responsibilities for the SSFL site, and five representatives of the community. The SSFL Work Group meets regularly to share information regarding the environmental issues related to the SSFL site.

The SSFL Work Group is not a decision-making body or an advisory committee. Membership on the SSFL Work Group does not affect any agency's regulatory jurisdiction or responsibilities, nor does it extend the regulatory or decision-making authority of any member.

B. <u>Membership</u>

The regulatory agencies represented on the SSFL Work Group include:

Objectives C.

The objectives of the SSFL Work Group are to:

- 1) Facilitate the exchange of information among the regulatory agencies and between the regulatory agencies and the community regarding the SSFL site;
- Coordinate regulatory agencies' activities as 2) necessary; and
- Allow the public an opportunity to receive 3) information, ask questions and express concerns to Rockwell and the regulatory agencies.

D. Rules for the Meetings

- 1) EPA serves as the chair of the SSFL Work Group.
- All SSFL Work Group meetings will be conducted 2) in public.
- The Federal Advisory Committee Act (FACA) does 3) not apply to the SSFL Work Group since the regulatory agencies do not solicit consensus advice or recommendations from the five community representatives as a group.
- The SSFL Work Group members do not vote on 4) decisions or recommendations. All the Work Group members address comments and recommendations to the other members on an individual basis.
- The SSFL Work Group meetings are held quarterly - 5) until June 30, 1991. At that time, the Work Group expires, unless a decision is made to

continue the Work Group meetings. Regardless of the existence of the Work Group, each agency will continue to fulfill its regulatory and oversight responsibilities.

6) The SSFL Work Group actively solicits input from the general public during the meetings.
