Environmental Advocacy for the proper clean-up of the Santa Susana Field Laboratory (SSFL) currently owned by Boeing, and other legacy sites leaving contamination for future generations to deal with. Senate Bill 990 (Kuehl/Brownley) and recent commitments by the State of California in a historic letter of intent written between the state and the people, offer new hope in a clean-up battle that has lasted for decades.

ACME and [cleanuprocketdyne.org](http://cleanuprocketdyne.org) have joined to provide a place for people to meet and discuss the challenges of today's site characterization and clean-up under the RCRA (Resource Conservation Recovery Act) Facility Investigation and clean-up scheduled for completion in 2017.

We feel that this process must be watched every step of the way, as the community has been waiting for decades for real action to take place. With SB990 and Assembly Member Smyth's AB 1846 to establish over-

sight over the creation of a state park based on Boeing's commitment to donate the property to open-space when the Governor signed the bill (SB990). This important bi-partisan effort needs the support of the surrounding communities so our voice is heard.

This Museum/Gallery will serve as a meeting space and will be used to provide thought-provoking discussion in reviewing the options for clean-up and remediation of the site, as well as its' affect on the surrounding communities. The people who will live with the decisions made during the clean-up process, should be part of that process. That's what we hope to create here in our new Chatsworth Museum.

Housing Developments on

both sides of the lab are under consideration today at Dayton Canyon (Centex Homes at Roscoe and Valley Circle Blvd's) and Runkle Canyon on the Simi Valley side, closest to Area IV where most of the nuclear work was conducted. DTSC entered into a CLRRA Agreement (California's Land Reuse and Revitalization Act) on April 23, 2008 with Runkle Canyon, LLC., regarding assessment and possible remediation of the site releases of hazardous substances that may have come from SSFL.

Following SB990, Assembly Member Julia Brownley authored AB2733 (Brownley also co-authored SB990) to bring forth new legislation as a direct

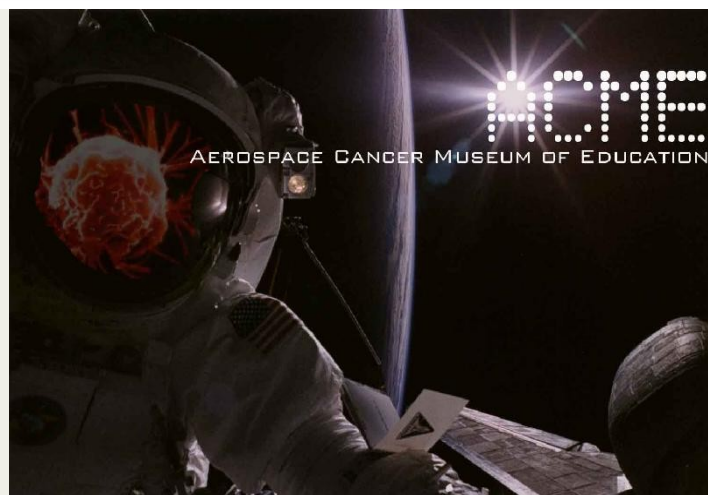
result of the lack of warning that SSFL neighbors had of the risks they had unknowingly assumed because
